

## College Prep List Senior Edition

Narrow your list of possible colleges—aim to apply to 2–5 schools.
Make sure your official ACT scores and transcript are sent to the colleges in which you are applying.
Ask your teachers for college recommendation letters. Viterbo may require these for particular scholarship competitions.
Apply for college. Be sure your admission essay is edited and has been looked over by a teacher, counselor, or trusted peer.
Submit your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) starting Oct. 1.  This will help financial aid offices determine your eligibility for need-based grants, loans, or work-study options.
Visit the colleges in which you have been accepted. Schedule a campus tour. This will help you to narrow down your choices.  www.viterbo.edu/visit
Let colleges know whether you will accept or reject their admission offer by May 1. Visit Viterbo's Accepted Students page for additional information:  www.viterbo.edu/accepted
Let your counselor know your college choice soon after you decide. Ask them for any other assistance you might need.
Send your deposit to your chosen college as soon as you make your final choice.
After graduation, be sure to have your financial transcript sent to your college.
