Registering to Vote vs. Voting

• You can't vote in an election unless you've registered to vote. Registration can happen when voting in person, but many people register in advance of voting. Please note: the latest date you can register to vote is the Friday before the election in which you'd like to vote.

What should I bring to register to vote and/or vote?

On-Campus Students Bring:

- Your voter-compliant Viterbo Student ID, Wisconsin driver's license, passport, or military ID.
- Your "Tuition Statement-Proof of Residency" printed off VitNet. To get your tuition statement, take the following steps:
 - o On VitNet, click on "Students"
 - o Scroll down to "Financial Aid" and click "Tuition Statement—Proof of Residency"
 - Enter the semester, click, and print all pages of your proof of residency letter

Off-Campus Students Bring:

- Your voter-compliant Viterbo Student ID, Wisconsin driver's license, passport, or military ID.
- A bank statement, phone bill, credit card statement, utility bill or residential lease that bears your name and local address. A full of list documents that can illustrate proof of residency can be found at https://elections.wi.gov/.

Those without a WI Driver's License: know the last four digits of your Social Security #!

Where do I vote?

- Viterbo students living on campus in Bonaventure, Marian, McDonald, Rose, La Verna, or Treacy vote at Coulee Recovery Center, 933 Ferry St., La Crosse, WI, 54601.
- Viterbo students living on campus in Canticle or Clare vote at the Southside Neighborhood Center, 1300 6th Street South, La Crosse, WI, 54601.
- Off-Campus students can find their polling place at <u>https://myvote.wi.gov/en-US/FindMyPollingPlace</u>
- All students may register and vote at La Crosse City Hall (400 La Crosse Street) between 8:30am & 5pm up to two weeks before Election Day. This is a great option as there won't be lines and staff can assist you! City Hall is a 20-minute walk or free 14-minute bus ride (w/VU ID); plan your bus trip at <u>https://www.cityoflacrosse.org/mtu</u>.

What time can I vote on Election Day?
