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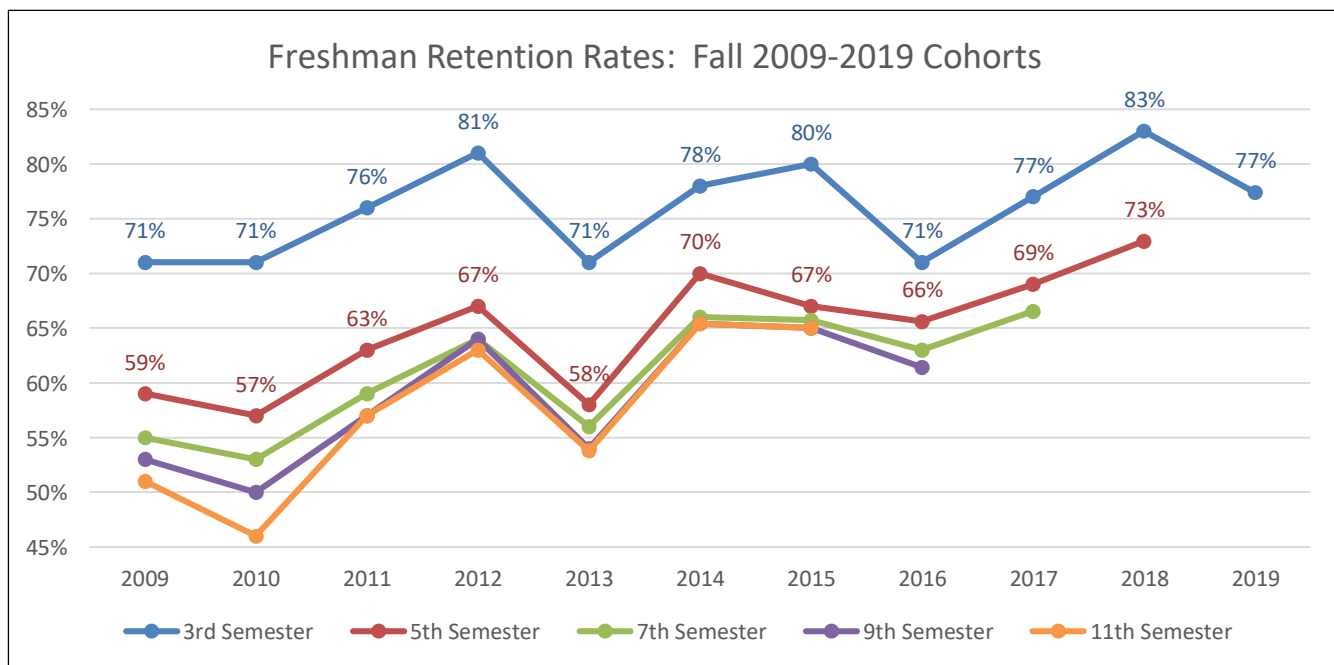
## Freshman Retention Rates

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### Entering Cohorts of First-Time, Full-Time, Degree-Seeking, Undergraduate Students

The retention rates are based on the first-time, full-time, degree-seeking undergraduate cohort groups. In alignment with the National Center for Education Statistics, exclusions from the cohort groups are allowed for military activations or deployments, deaths, and permanent disabilities. The retention rate for a given time interval is computed by dividing the number of students from the originally enrolled group who were registered or graduated after that given time interval by the number in the group when originally enrolled, taking into account exclusions at that time. For example, the 3<sup>rd</sup> semester retention rate for the Fall 2019 cohort is the percentage of the full-time, first-time, freshmen who entered Viterbo in Fall 2019 and were enrolled at Viterbo at census date of Fall 2020.
