All Saints and All Souls begin this month of remembrance. Our tradition at San Damiano has been to display an altar on which you are invited to place pictures of your deceased family and friends and/or inscribe their names in the Book of the Living. Prayers and music like the In Paradiso fill us with emotion and memory – as well as help us reflect on the brevity of life and the importance of good Christian living.

Veterans Day is celebrated on the 11th and it coincides with the feast of Saint Martin of Tours, the patron of military chaplains. When I taught Navy chaplains, my first class was always about Martin's life and his charity. The legend has it that, while riding his horse doing military patrols, Martin saw a man freezing from the cold, so he took off his cloak, split it in two, gave half to the man and...later that night in a dream, the "man" appeared with his piece of cloak and revealed that He was the Christ. Martin's half was later kept and venerated and thus, the word for cloak is capella later to become capellan which means chaplain. He has long since been the model for military chaplains to come.

The tradition of Martin was/is still big in Europe where it is a sort of Thanksgiving Day. The fare is not centered on turkey but on goose. So when the pilgrims came to America, they brought this tradition with them – and continued the tradition of sharing the legend of Saint Martin: give not only of your surplus, but of your very sustenance.

All these commemorations frame the month of November yet even though the days get hectic with the holiday craze, we still focus on the Scriptures which highlight what we said above: the brevity of life and the end times. The Sunday of Christ the King will assert the supreme authority of Christ over humans and their institutions..and beyond it we will see Advent dawning with its perspective of the LORD's Coming in glory.

Let us pray for peace in Ukraine. Let us continue to have compassion for La Crosse's homeless. Let us give thanks for our Mother Earth and take comfort that we rest on the memories of the Saints and those who have gone before us...and let us imitate the charity of Martin who saw the face of Christ in an act of charity! Pax et Bonum!

CELEBRATIONS AND THE SAINTS

Many of us growing up remember we had certain foods on certain holidays. Just think about it. But did you celebrate a holy day or a Saint day with a certain recipe?

The Europeans can help us here.

- St Martin Day (called Martinmas in Europe) is, as mentioned above, celebrated with roast goose. It is also celebrated with bonfires, parades and other desserts.
 - I remember my mother saying in Polish that Saint Martin may come " riding his white horse" meaning you may see the season's first snowflakes on his feastday ...
 - thus the tradition of "Marcinki" translated as St Martin's Horseshoes a kind of sweet roll.

Like other recipes, it is reprinted from Cooking for Christ and if you check the internet, you can find other versions which are much more elaborate. But as for that snow...well, I am not in hurry to see the "white horse" just yet.

SAINT MARTIN'S HORSESHOES or MARCINKI

1 cup of butter 4 tablespoons of sugar 2 cups all purpose flour 1 cup ground unblanched almonds 1 teaspoon almond extract

Yield: 3 dozen

Cream butter and sugar. Add the other ingredients and mix thoroughly blended. With fingers, shape into horseshoes about 3 inches long and 1 inch thick. Place on greased cookie sheet and bake at 300 degrees for about 35 minutes. Cool. Roll in confectioners sugar

Campus Ministry Corner by Emilio Alvarez



Secular Franciscan Order (OFS)


Interested in the learning more about the 3rd Order Secular Franciscans? The
