Student Outcome Data Master of Arts in Servant Leadership Updated May 2019

Graduation Rates:

For students who progress at a full-time status, the expected time to graduate with a Master of Servant Leadership degree is two years, consisting of six terms. The Program runs year round with fall, spring and summer sessions, and new cohorts starting each fall and spring semester. The two-year, six-term completion rate for students who start in fall averages 25%. Because students in the MASL program typically work fulltime as private and public enterprise leaders, it is not uncommon for students to take a semester off or progress at a slower rate to balance the demands of their professional and personal lives. The increased graduation rates in the third and fourth year after enrollment display that trend. The overall third and fourth year graduation rates average 50% and 54% respectively.

Enrollment and Retention:

Enrollment has remained steady between Spring 2018 and Spring 2019, after a dip from Fall 2015, which was our largest enrollment since Spring 2013. The overall enrollment average for 2017-2019 is at 78% of the historic MASL average. Retention rates average 71.5% for data collected from 2013-2018.
