³A minor is encouraged. Common minors of interest to psychology majors: criminal justice, ethics, family studies, gerontology, neuroscience, philosophy, Spanish, substance abuse counseling. Students must complete 120 credits (including 40 credits upper division) for B.S. degree.

⁴Second semester juniors who qualify can apply for the 4+2 option with Viterbo's Masters of Science in Mental Health Counseling (MSMHC) program. 4+2 students get an early start on their MSMHC degree and can complete it in just two years after earning their B.S. in psychology.
