Faculty Advisor

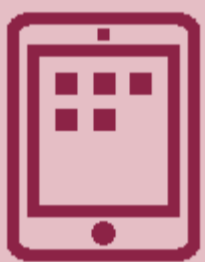
Faculty Advisors are the experts in their discipline. They are important resources for students throughout their time at Viterbo.
