Serving the Common Good REFLECTIVE JOURNAL ENTRY

All sections of Serving the Common Good require at least FOUR structured, reflective journal entries. The format for journal entries may vary among each instructor, but should contain a detailed description of the event (minimum of 150 words) with a reflection on what was learned from the service learning experience (minimum of 600 words).

Citations/formatting styles TBD by instructor.

Service Experience:

- Date of Service Experience
- Time Frame of Service Experience
- Who did you work with (grade, age, teacher, etc.)?
- What did you do?
- Where did you do it?

Articulation of Learning:

- How does what you experienced and/or observed in this service learning visit
 connect to course content (texts, articles, websites, class activities, videos,
 etc.)? Be specific. Use citations where and where appropriate.
- How is/are this experience and/or observation relevant to the common good in the world and society?

Analysis & Reflection of Learning:

- What questions do you have after experiencing and/or observing during this service learning visit?
- What new understanding has occurred as a result of analyzing your service?
- Reflect any process of change in your attitude, actions, etc. that you may be experiencing. If you are not experiencing any change, note that and comment on that.
- How do issues of social justice connect to your experience and analysis?
