FALL 2020 COVID-19 RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES VITERBO UNIVERSITY OFFICE OF RESIDENCE LIFE

In order to keep our community safe, both the University and our residential students have an obligation to care for each other.

In this document, we've outlined your **rights** (what you can expect from us) and your **responsibilities** (what we expect from you) during the Fall 2020 semester. Please read carefully, and reach out to us at residencelife@viterbo.edu with quesitons.

You have the **right** to a support system on campus. We're modifying our approach to RA programming, we've designated a number of on-campus spaces as isolation housing, and offices including Campus Activities, Health Services, and Counseling Services are ready to support you both virtually and in-person.

You have the **responsibility** to monitor your health and complete your daily COVID-19 symptom screening. If you begin to experience symptoms, please stay home and contact Health Services. **There is no shame in contracting the virus**; please protect your community by following our outlined procedures.

You have the **right** to a clean environment. We commit to increasing cleaning in common spaces, including lounges and restrooms. We have also provided you with hand sanitizer at move-in, which we will refill as we have supplies available.

You have the **responsibility** to keep your personal space clean. We ask that you regularly sanitize your living space, including your outer doorknob, and practice good hygiene.

You have the **right** to be protected by your community. We commit to requiring masks in all common spaces (everywhere that is not your apartment/room).

You have the **responsibility** to contribute to a safe community. We ask that you make informed decisions regarding where you go and how you spend your free time, and that you wear a mask any time you are not in your room.



You have the **right** to spaces that are appropriately physically distanced. We have posted occupancy limits outside all common spaces, shut off every other sink in community restrooms, and removed some furniture to make distancing within shared spaces easier.

You have the **responsibility** to abide by both our occupancy limits and our **no-guest policy**. You may not have anyone in your living space that does not live there. This includes visiting other residence hall/apartment rooms.
