


What is the Dual Degree Program?

- Students complete 3 years at an undergraduate institution and 3 years at MCW to complete a bachelor's degree and the Doctor of Pharmacy degree in just 6 years!
- Students apply for admission to the dual degree program and are interviewed twice by an MCW pharmacy faculty member.
- Undergraduate advisors know the courses at your institution that will satisfy MCW's prerequisites for admission.
- Admitted students have opportunities to engage with MCW faculty, staff, and students during undergraduate years.
- After Year 1 at MCW, students submit a transcript of their PharmD coursework to their undergrad institution, which in turn confers the baccalaureate degree.

Our dual degree program helps students achieve their career goal in as few as 6 years instead of the traditional 8!





The School of Pharmacy's 3-year tuition is consistent with other 4-year private institutions.


