

## **Federal Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriation Act (CRRSAA) Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) II Allocation**

Viterbo University had previously signed and returned to the Department of Education the Certification and Agreement form required to receive HEERF funds.

Viterbo has received \$639,954 of HEERF II funds for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

Approximately 2,295 students were enrolled at Viterbo University on March 2, 2021 and eligible to receive HEERF II Emergency Financial Aid Grants under CRRSAA.

As of March 31, 2021, \$639,954 of the \$639,954 of HEERF II Emergency Financial Aid Grants has been distributed to students. No additional grants will be given.

As of March 31, 2021, 542 students have received a HEERF II Emergency Financial Aid Grant.

Method used by Viterbo University to determine which students received HEERF II Emergency Financial Aid Grants, and the amount they received:

Viterbo University first identified undergraduate and graduate students who were enrolled at least half-time in a degree or certificate program on March 2, 2021, and who had a 2020-2021 FAFSA on file in the Viterbo University financial aid office and were eligible for Title IV aid, as students who may receive HEERF II Emergency Financial Aid Grants. HEERF II Emergency Financial Aid Grants were then given to undergraduate students and graduate students with exceptional financial need, identified as students who had an expected family contribution (EFC) of less than \$5,711.

Each student who received a HEERF II Emergency Financial Aid Grant received notification via email of the award amount, disbursement method, and expected timing of the disbursement. Students were advised that they were permitted to use HEERF II Emergency Financial Aid Grants to make payment toward student account balances, and were provided with instructions on how to do so.

Grant amounts varied, dependent upon undergraduate vs. graduate status, full-time vs. less than full-time status for undergraduate students, and dependency status for undergraduate students.
