Martha Hennessy is the seventh child of Dorothy Day's only child Tamar. Martha has been arrested and imprisoned protesting nuclear weapons, war, the use of drones, the torture of prisoners in Guantanamo and other prisons, and the use of starvation as a weapon of war in Yemen.
