ACADEMIC MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS

Admitted first-year students are considered for these academic merit scholarships based on their academic marks—in particular, cumulative high school GPA and test scores, if students have them. Admitted students have until **Jan. 15** to submit improved test scores or transcripts to attempt to increase their academic scholarship. Students living off campus will have awards reduced by \$2,000. These are annual awards for four years, provided the student remains in good academic standing at Viterbo.

NEED-BASED FINANCIAL AID

To apply for need-based financial aid (grants, particular scholarships, tuition promise, work-study, or loans), file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) starting **Oct. 1, 2022**. To ensure consideration for all financial aid options, complete the FAFSA and any additional required documentation prior to Viterbo's priority date of **Feb. 1, 2023**.
