examination or portfolio. Official transcripts show the school seal and signature of the registrar.

CREDIT/CALENDAR All credit awarded by Viterbo University is semester hours of credit. One unit of credit stands for one

class period of fifty (50) minutes in length. Unless noted otherwise, coursework in the semester is

approximately 15 weeks in length.

COURSE NUMBERING Since 1970, lower division courses are numbered 100-299 and upper division courses are numbered

300-499. Graduate courses are numbered 500 and above. Remedial coursework is numbered 1-99 and is not applicable to a degree. Prior to 1970, course numbers 1-99 (lower division) were open to students in the freshmen and sophomore years, and those numbered 100-199 (upper division) to students in the junior and senior years. Course numbers 286, 486, 782, 783, 784, 786, 884, or 886 and/or "ST" prefix in titles designate special topics courses. Course numbers 288, 488, 588, or 788 and/or "IS" prefix in titles designate an independent study. EDUC-510, 546, 547, 548, and 549 also

indicate special topics courses.
