Apply for Admission

- Apply online for free at www.viterbo.edu/apply. Minimum 2.25 GPA required. Must be a graduate from an accredited (NLNAC) associate or diploma degree program. Some exceptions may be granted from non-accredited technical schools. Licensed RN (by second nursing course in program).
- Request all official transcripts from any college(s) you have attended. Official copies of transcripts must be sent from the institution directly to Viterbo University. We also accept electronic transcripts from Parchment, National Clearinghouse, and Credential Solutions. Viterbo will evaluate transcripts for free.
