- University Update Rick Trietley
  - o 325 new students freshman and transfers to arrive this fall
    - 1,100 total undergrad with 2,100 total grad and undergrad students
    - Freshman class 3.5% average GPA, 82% from MN/WI, 31% first generation, 47% student athletes
  - Currently just had the highest summer enrollment in 5 years which was a 6% increase from last summer
  - Currently have 250 military aligned students just named in the top 10 military friendly schools
  - o 20 sports teams
    - e-sports is the newest edition to begin this fall
  - New programs speech pathology, computer science, master of nursing, doctoral degree in ethical leadership
  - Engineering program started 4 years ago so now the accreditation will begin
  - Key partnerships
    - Aguinas High School students take classes
    - University of Luxembourg working on an agreement
    - Peru Casa Hogar working to coordinate spring break trips, service projects and study abroad opportunities
    - Working on one new agreement per year
  - Jim Salmo and his team are working on a possible capital campaign for 2025.
    The next step is a feasibility study.
  - Any student who is pell grant certified will be able to come to Viterbo for free which is a great mission.
  - o 50 new employees to begin this fall amount is similar to last year
  - Vision 2027 "Imagine, Believe, Act" was shared.
